President's Column

Greetings fellow archers. The recent low turnout at our Outdoor MAA 420 tournament has generated a lot of discussion about ways to increase participation at this tournament. Granted, if the cancellations and no-shows had made the tournament, the discussions may not have ever happened. However, with the suggestions received so far, I see opportunity to improve this tournament and potentially increase participation. As of this writing, I have 14 good suggestions from our membership. Some of the suggestions address the tournament and its format, some address the tournament date. You will be seeing more about these suggestions in the near future in a survey. When you do see these suggestions, be sure to provide your input. At the MAA Fall meeting, the input that you provide from the survey will be needed to help decide a direction to take this tournament.

Next, during the discussions mentioned above, a good question was asked about the status of outdoor tournaments in other states. As your NFAA representative, I do get to hear about archery in other states and talk to other state representatives. Compared to other states, Michigan has the best programs. All states have been seeing an overall decline in outdoor archery for some time. Indiana is down to two clubs with 28 target Field ranges. Illinois is the same. Michigan has 13 clubs with 28-target Field courses, and 6 clubs with 14-target Field ranges. The NFAA representatives from other states find it hard to believe that Michigan has that many Field courses. I can remember reading a magazine article in the early/mid 1970's that reported the fact that during the mid 1950's, Michigan had more Field courses than Golf courses. It seemed that most villages, towns and cities had an archery club. The cost and work required to maintain a Field course were the main reasons given as to why archery was seeing the decline in Field courses. The slow decline in outdoor archery is nothing new. There is a 1950's article posted in the Washtenaw Sportsman's Club indoor range from the Michigan Archer magazine. It reported that 544 archers shot in the MET Field & Hunter championship. That was when a normal Field shoot was 28 Field targets in the morning followed by 28 Hunter targets after lunch. In the 1970's, the MAA outdoor PAA (now the outdoor MAA) had over 500 archers when it was held in Grayling at Bear Mountain. However, in recent years, the number of youth that have been introduced to archery can reverse the overall decline in archery. In early June, the Livingston Conservation and Sportsman's Association had an archery youth appreciation day. 492 young archers attended. Many archery clubs in Southeastern Michigan have youth programs with 100 or more young archers enrolled. Other parts of the state have very successful youth programs as well. I have always said that if we can retain 5% of those young archers, the sport of archery will grow. I would certainly like to see more of those young archers get involved in outdoor archery. One thing that is certain, the indoor national tournaments are growing larger every year.

Our Annual Board of Directors Fall meeting is scheduled for October 19th in Grayling at 9:00 AM. The deadline for Associations to submit proposals for listing on the meeting agenda is 70 days prior to the meeting. This meeting can be attended by any MAA member as a guest.

DELEGATES AND OFFICERS INTRODUCTION: Each of the delegates and officers introduced themselves to those present and were recognized and noted.

2. **MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING:** Minutes from the Fall 2018 Meeting were reviewed. Motion made by Ron Hall, seconded by John Dumar, to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. MOTION PASSED.

3. PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

President Mike Spence thanked all for attending this meeting. Due to the agenda items and the number of items under New Business, we will be keeping our breaks short.

Items under New Business will include: 1) A discussion on election committee. 2) Assigning an election committee. 3) Discussion about on-line registration or card swipe committee. 4) Making a Marketing and Public Relations Manager an Appointed position. 5) Do we want to change the meeting location?

Overall indoor tournaments went smoothly. I'm looking forward to the outdoor tournaments.

4. MEMBERSHIP COORDINATOR'S REPORT

Rick Hotchkiss presented Carol Bitner's written report.

Total current membership is 610 (64 with no regional affiliation). Membership is down 49 from this time last year.

Motion made by Ron Hall, seconded by Jack Romeo to accept the Membership Coordinator's Report. MOTION PASSED.

5. TREASURER'S REPORT.

Rick Hotchkiss presented the written Treasurer's Report. The report detailed income and expenses from all sources including charters, club teams, interest, map books, membership fees, patches, pins, tournament fees, club splits, office supplies, and miscellaneous. The report included the Balance Sheet showing current assets including money in the checking and savings accounts and inventory.

A motion was made by Rusty Curtis, seconded by Fran Kullik, to accept the Treasurer's Report. MOTION PASSED

6. CHARTER SECRETARY'S REPORT

Rick Hotchkiss presented Carol Bitner's written report. There are 53 clubs affiliated, 24 MAA only and 29 NFAA/MAA. Some associations only have one club. They will need to add another club or be absorbed into another association.

A motion was made by Larry Boone, seconded by Joe Powers, to accept the Charter Secretary's Report. MOTION PASSED.

7. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

Trish Jackson presented a verbal report. Please remember to sign the Sign in Sheet. Contracts are available today for associations taking a shoot for 2020. Please make sure that you get a contract and return it to me within the stated time (60 days prior to the Fall meeting) by the end of August. That way a list of tournaments and contacts will be available at the Fall Meeting.

A motion was made by Rusty Curtis, seconded by Jack Romeo, to accept the verbal report. MOTION PASSED.

8. AWARD SECRETARY'S REPORT

Scott Hansen thanked the registration chairpersons especially the UP for returning the scorecards quickly. Thank you for the working with the youth to fill out their cards correctly. There is still an issue with mistakes on scorecards. There were more A and B class shooters this year than the last few years. Unofficial results are posted on Facebook within 24 hours of receiving from chairpersons. We have plenty of medals and will not need to order any this year. Scott polled attendees about changing the color of plaques.

A motion was made by Larry Boone, seconded by Fran Kulik, to accept the verbal report. MOTION PASSED.

9. EDITOR'S REPORT

John Dumar reminded Scott Hansen that he needs results in Excel format. Mailed magazines are out later than if members get them emailed. John received payment for one ad.

A motion was made by Ron Hall, seconded by Larry Boone, to accept the verbal report. MOTION PASSED.

10. NFAA DELEGATE'S REPORT

Mike Spence presented his report:

Some good news. Michigan had 7 indoor national champions. Debra Ochs (PSFFS), Valerie Aten (AFFS), Shelly Saxwold (SFFS), Ashley Montri (YFBHFS), Rocky Cummins Jr (YMFS), Dick Hanlon (MSMBB) and Jerry Tesch (SSMBHFS).

The next NFAA Directors meeting will be July 2019, the day after the National Field Championship concludes. Joe Kapp has three proposals.

Dates: Outdoor Sectionals will be June 15th and 16th at Panther Creek Archery Club in Illinois. This will be the last year in Illinois and the next state in the rotation is Wisconsin. If Wisconsin turns it down, Michigan is next in the rotation.

National Field and Hunter championship (Yankton) July 26-28

North American Field Archery Championship, August 23, 24, 25 at Washtenaw Sportsmans Club.

Next year the Indoor National Championship will be in Louisville.

NFAA sent a questionnaire to members inquiring about reducing the shooting time limit to 3 ½ minutes.

Explained Junior archers moving up a Division. Once they move up they have to stay in the Division.

Adults can jump back and forth.

The NFAA has awarded a Michigan member an Honorary Life Membership. It will be presented to the member prior to the awards ceremony at the outdoor MAA 420 championship.

A motion was made by Rusty Curtis, seconded by Jeff Kohler, to accept the NFAA Delegate's Report. MOTION PASSED.

Holding weekly indoor shoots. Averaging 60-120 shooters, 127 for Valley Championship. Spot Leagues down at most clubs. Still getting new shooters.

Southwestern Michigan Archery League:

Numbers way up in January, but dropped later in the year. Youth numbers steady. Actively seeking new clubs.

Straits Field Archery Association:

Steady tournament numbers. GT Area Archers merging with Kingsley and applied to DNR for a grant for an indoor range.

Tri-County Archery Association:

Detroit Archers are hosting the outdoor 3D. Detroit Sportsmen's Congress held level 1 and 2 Instructors Training Course on May 17, 18. Level 3 Instructor's Class held in May at Rising Phoenix Archery. New club joined- Oakland Township Archery. High School tournament was cancelled due to low numbers.

Upper Peninsula Field Archery Association:

Lost a few adults, but gained some kids, who also shot the state shoot. Goal is to have them shoot Nationals next year.

Pro Rep:

Tim Loynes apologized for not hosting indoor Pro Am. Will add Pro AM (UPers and Trolls) to Outdoor 420 along with a potluck on Saturday night at 5 pm at Mid Michée Bowman. Paul De Pover Bowling for Dollars will take place at the 900. Jeremiah Starks made the shoot off at Vegas. Chris Schnur made the shoot off at Indoor Nationals. Cara Kelly placed 2nd at Indoor Nationals. Dress code violations were addressed with the people who were in violation.

12. COMMITTEE REPORTS**Electronic Registration**

Jim Grubba moved out of state. No progress made. Will discuss under new business the ability to accept credit card payments prior to registration. Alternatives discussed. Mike Spence assigned a committee of Sherry Lance, Joe Powers and Eric Beaudry to work on a complete proposal to be presented at the Fall 2019 meeting.

Marketing and Public Relations

Ted Lemanski reported on progress on implementing a marketing and public relations proposal. 24 Pro shops and 34 manufacturers are located in Michigan. Ted outlined objectives to grow ads and sponsorship of MAA tournaments. Ted outlined a proposal to sell sponsorships including ad space. Sponsors would be encouraged to provide products to be used as "door prizes". Discussion on how to handle donations of products. John Dumar spoke about the challenges of increasing ads in the AIM magazine including increased costs of printing and postage.

Suggestions for the position include contacting the press to cover events and champions and sending a flyer to the different Pro shops who are not members of MAA.

Eric Beaudry suggested an increase in MAA activity on social media in addition to newspapers.

A motion was made by John Dumar, second by Ron Hall to send all Pro Shops information on the MAA and include their name and information on the MAA website in return for distributing the MAA flyer. MOTION PASSED

A Motion was made by Eric Beaudry, seconded by Rusty Curtis to allow Ted Lemanski to advance with his proposal for one year and to use his discretion to work with manufacturers of products and add ads to MAA website and social media. Ted will report on progress at the next meeting. MOTION PASSED

Registration Chairperson's Report

Rick Hotchkiss presented the Registration Chairperson's report. He discussed the average for shoots. The numbers have declined substantially over the last 10 years. The MAA 420 tournament has decreased since instituting 420 scoring. There are complaints that shooters don't like the face because there is no X. A motion was made by John Dumar, seconded by Dave Barnsdale to add a NFAA X to the MAA target face if possible. MOTION PASSED

Ron Hall discussed the timing of the MAA 420 tournament and that people don't want to shoot that late. Consider moving the tournaments to the last 2 weekends of January, February and March.

There should be enough Indoor scorecards available for next year. Rick just printed outdoor scorecards for this year and next year. He may need to print a few more.

There was one returned check from indoor tournaments. A letter has been sent to the person.
